The role

We are seeking a talented Research Manager to join our team to run a portfolio of qualitative and quantitative studies from proposal through to delivery. You will be responsible for the delivery of a portfolio of projects whilst maintaining familiarity with current industry practices and regulatory requirements (e.g. GCP, BHBIA Code of Practice, GDPR). Your responsibilities will include:

This role is based in our Amersham office.
